Literary Series

The Friends of the Library sponsored the Library's first Literary Series in 2017, connecting patrons with over twenty published authors ranging from children's authors to graphic novelists. The Series featured eight author talks and literary workshops on subjects such as self-publishing, creative writing, and songwriting. A poetry slam and artistic fusion performance rounded out the series.

Brain Teasers2

An Oregon Museum of Science and Industry traveling exhibit arrived in the fall, featuring twenty-one stations including mathematical puzzles and mind-boggling blocks. A Brain Health lecture series enhanced the exhibit, offering lectures presented by local experts on topics ranging from concussions to Alzheimer's Disease. 
Delivering Lifelong Learning


Technology Classes




Studio 300 Maker Space



Connecting with Community

The Teen Library Council partnered with community groups in 2017 to bring about positive change. They completed two construction projects, building dog houses for the Humane Society and the Library's first little library station which will be installed in the community soon.

Staff also led Library teens in a Be An Angel – Help a Soldier project in partnership with Mountain Home Schools, collecting items and assembling care stockings for deployed military.

The Library also partnered with the Baxter County Master Gardeners to introduce a Pollinator Garden supported by the Friends of the Library. The Master Gardeners group planted a variety of plants in the fall and will maintain this educational space for all who visit the Library to learn from and enjoy.





Library staff teams focused on expanding our reach in 2017 by increasing the number of Library cardholders, growing the Library's email distribution list, and defining our customer segments. The teams took action by putting policy and procedural changes into motion that had a direct impact on Library card and email list numbers.

Making an Impact on Early Literacy

In its fourth year, the Library's 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program continued to make an impact on early literacy by connecting with increased numbers of parents and caregivers of pre-school aged children. To do this, Library staff introduced a massive outreach to area day cares and Head Start programs, conducting a regular Story Time for 15 preschool classes. Speaking engagements at parent meetings expanded our reach even more.







Tech Cards

The Tech Card program expanded in 2017, placing a Library Tech Card in the hands of every Baxter County student in 6th through 9th grades, including Cotter, Norfork, and Mountain Home Schools. The cards allow students to access the wealth of resources available through the Library's website, including the newest resource, Brainfuse. Brainfuse provides live, online tutors in a variety of subjects for K–12 students. Youth services staff provided teacher and student training at the beginning of the school year. The Library was also on site at school open houses and parent/teacher nights, sharing Library resources with students and parents.



Volunteers

In 2017, forty-three library volunteers earned Presidential Volunteer Service awards. Margie Kelly and Donna Banaszynski earned Gold level Presidential honors, contributing more than 500 hours. Howard Duvall, John Reckard, Margaret Park and Susan Nixon contributed 250 to 499 hours, earning Presidential Silver status. Thirty-seven volunteers contributed 100 to 249 hours, earning Presidential Bronze honors.

Audrey Burns was a Mountain Home Area Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Volunteer of the Year Award nominee.

The branch had experienced a steady decrease in visitors and circulation since the opening of the Donald W. Reynolds Library building in October 2010.



Library Staff

In 2017, the Library employed a total of 24 staff members, including a combination of part-time and fulltime staff. Library Staff had an amazing list of accomplishments including the establishment of teams that began work on the Library's Strategic Plan goals. The Library Card and E-mail Distribution List teams exceeded their goals for the year, making great progress on expanding the Library's reach in the

Looking Forward

In early 2018, the Library is hosting the Dinosaurs: Fossils Exposed exhibit from the Museum of Discovery along with an exciting assortment of family programs. In the fall, we will host our 2nd annual Literary Series.

Programs such as the Pollinator Garden and Ancestry.com classes will provide a wealth of learning opportunities. An expansion of outreach for the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program to area pre-schools and Head Start programs will make a significant impact on early literacy skills in our community. And new Coding Clubs will equip children with basic computer coding skills.

The Library team will continue to focus on our Five-Year Strategic Plan goals. We will be rethinking our delivery of lifelong learning by redefining our customer segments and customize programming accordingly. The Library Foundation will be working on the development of a donor cultivation and planned giving strategy.

Two Community Task Forces established by the Library and comprised of community leaders will tackle some important issues facing our community. The Early Literacy Task Force will focus efforts on improving literacy skills for children from birth to Kindergarten. The Job Seeker Task Force will work on consolidating community services for job skills training, resume development, and more.

With our core purpose of inspiring imagination, igniting interests, and enabling learning at the heart of what we do every day, Library staff and volunteers are poised to make some memorable Library experiences happen in 2018!
